

SAFER INTERNET DAY

This week, our school actively participated in Safer Internet Day, held on February 11th, 2025. This global event promotes the safe and positive use of digital technology, especially among children and young people.

In Key Stage 1, children enjoyed reading "Digiduck's Big Decision," a story that teaches young children about online safety and the importance of making smart choices in the digital world. This great story helped our younger pupils understand the value of kindness and caution when navigating the internet.

In Key Stage 2, discussions focused on personal information—what it is, and what should or shouldn't be shared online. Pupils learned the importance of communicating online as they would face-to-face, emphasising respect and kindness. They also considered the types of information their parents might share online and how adults serve as role models in digital behaviour.

Class 1

We read 'Digiduck's Big Decision' and joined a live lesson about how to keep safe online & what information we should & shouldn't share.

Class 4

We talked about trust and sharing information online. What apps are safe to use.

We also learnt about not commenting on school social media posts so that online strangers do not know which school we go to.

Class 9

We were on a school visit to Safetyworks (see below) where we learnt about peer pressure we will be looking at safer internet in more depth next week

Class 2

We read 'Digiduck's Big Decision' which encourages us to think about being a good friend online & introduces the idea that things shared online can also sometimes be copied by others

Class 5

We looked at what personal information is & whether we should share this online. If we have permission to share other people's details online. We identified 3 trusted adults who we could speak to if we had any worries.

Class 3

We also looked at Digiduck and at being a scam smasher & how this can make us vulnerable online

Class 6

We talked about the digital age of consent and what happens if you over share your personal details.

Class 7

We were looking at how people can contact you online to cause you harm and upset.

Safety Works

Our Year 6 pupils recently visited SafetyWorks!, an interactive safety centre in Newcastle upon Tyne. This centre provides innovative, enjoyable learning experiences, enabling pupils to participate safely in realistic situations illustrating everyday hazards and how to prevent them.

Water Safety: Understanding the dangers associated with open water and learning strategies to stay safe near rivers, lakes, and other bodies of water.

Fire Safety: Recognising fire hazards in different environments and practicing evacuation procedures to ensure a swift and safe response in case of a fire.

Railway Safety: Learning the importance of staying alert near railway tracks, understanding the risks, and knowing how to behave safely around trains and stations.

Age of Responsibility & Standing Up to Peer Pressure:

Discussing the concept of personal responsibility, understanding the legal implications of certain actions at their age, and developing strategies to resist peer pressure in various situations.







Emergency Procedures: Practicing how to effectively dial 999, including what information to provide and how to stay calm during emergencies.

Public Transport and Road Safety: Learning the importance of being vigilant while traveling, understanding traffic signals, and practicing safe behaviours as pedestrians and passengers.

This hands-on experience not only reinforced the safety topics covered in our curriculum but also provided the students with practical skills and knowledge to navigate various situations safely. We encourage parents to discuss these topics with their children to reinforce the importance of safety in everyday life.
